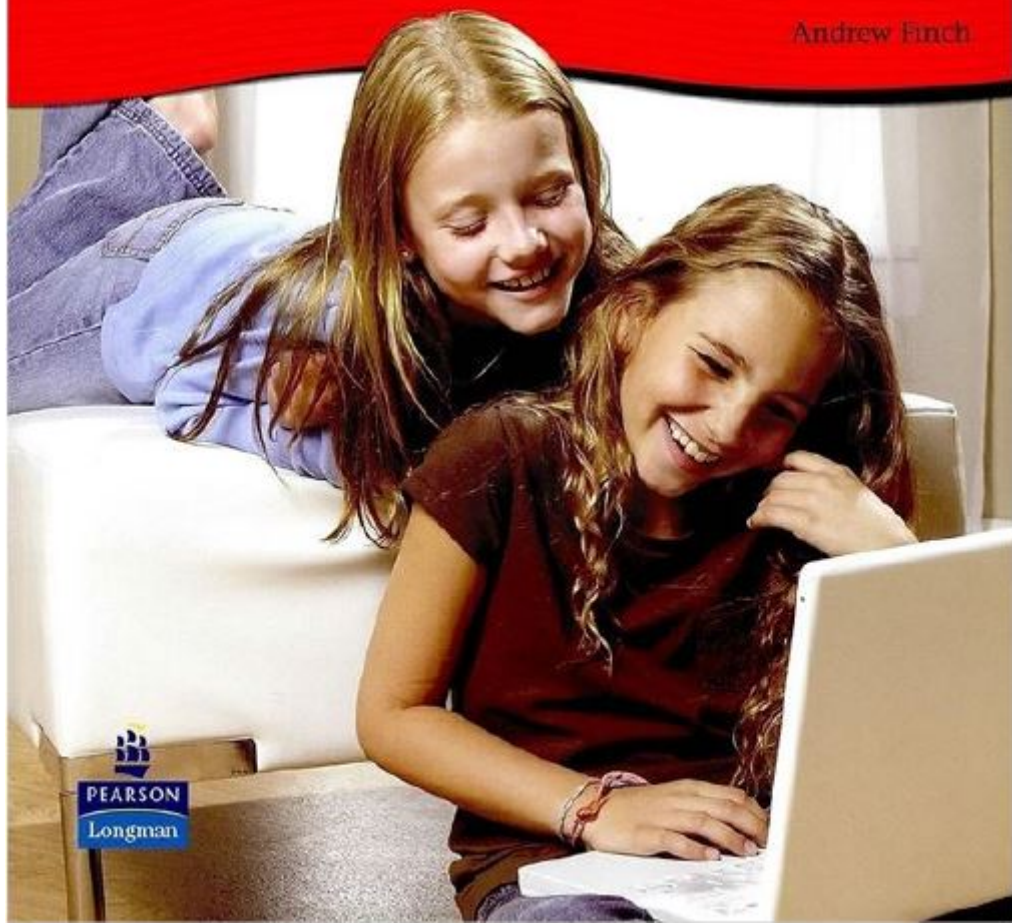

Warm-up Nice to meet you.

Activity [Groups: Up to 8 People]

- **Everybody:** Sit together in a circle.
